

Student Safety Expectations

The following are expectations for student conduct and safety when in a class or activity involving the use of potentially dangerous science materials. Students will:

- 1. Do what the teacher tells you to do. Follow all of the teacher's oral and written instructions and directions.
- 2. Follow all classroom rules. Do not disrupt or interfere with another student's safety or learning.
- 3. Remain in the classroom and work at your assigned station. Keep their assigned station orderly.
- 4. Properly wear goggles, gloves or other protective gear, as directed by the teacher.
- 5. Wait until the teacher has given permission to begin an activity.
- 6. Use laboratory materials and equipment only for the purpose intended. Do not do experiments other than those you are told to perform at that time in class.
- 7. Not eat, drink, smell or taste anything in the laboratory, classroom or during the activity, unless directed by the teacher. This includes food and drink, as well as chemicals.
- 8. Wash hands thoroughly after using chemicals and/or lab equipment.
- 9. Not touch their mouth, lips, or eyes when using chemicals, until after the student's hands have been thoroughly washed.
- 10. Report any injury, spill, or accident immediately to the teacher and follow the teacher's instructions.
- 11. Dispose of chemicals or other potentially hazardous materials as instructed by the teacher.

In order to remain in the class or activity, the student must follow these safety expectations. Failure to do so may result in discipline or suspension from class for the remainder of the period or longer, as determined appropriate by the principal or designee. Removal may mean loss of credit for the activity or the class.
